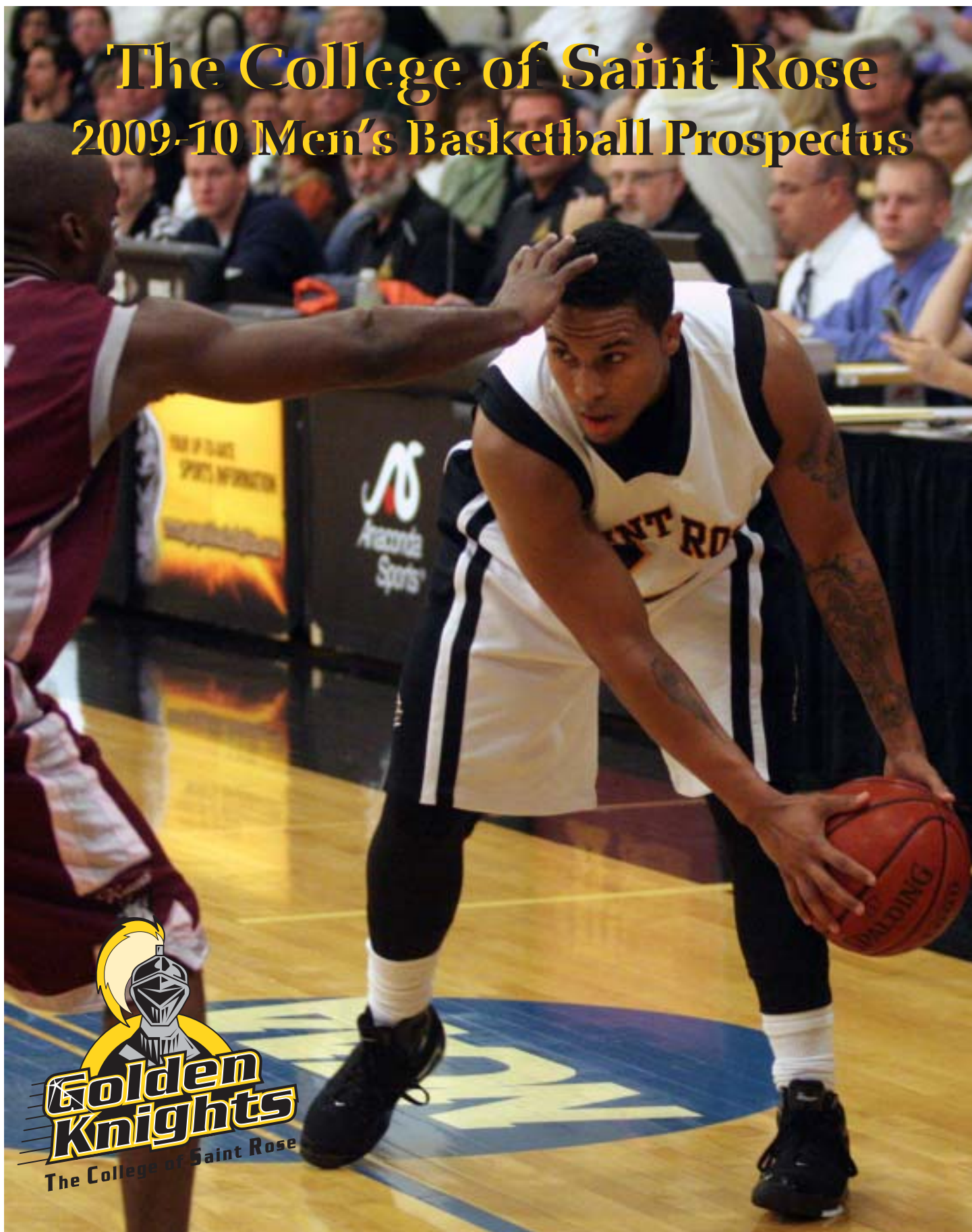

# Brian Beaury, Head Coach



Brian Beaury has steadfastly solidified himself as an outstanding basketball coach while developing a program that garners the utmost of respect from every corner, on every level of the collegiate game. Beaury, who is entering his 24<sup>th</sup> year at the helm of the Golden Knights, is again leaving an indelible impression upon a group of young men whose predecessors not only continually surpassed all expectations, but also provided The College of Saint Rose an avenue for national recognition.

“We have been very fortunate to have had great coaches and great players throughout the years. We have found a formula that works for us at Saint Rose. One of our goals is to attract players who will fit in with the rest of the College’s student body and who are poised to develop as students, people and as players. We want to develop a relationship where we’ll be their coach for four years and their friends forever,” says Beaury.

Beaury, who became just the 34<sup>th</sup> NCAA Division II head coach to reach the 500-win plateau last season, has an uncanny ability to instill his knowledge of the game into his student-athletes’ performance. His teams have won an average of more than 24 games during the last 13 campaigns and have posted at least 20 wins on nine occasions throughout that span.

Saint Rose won five consecutive regular-season East Coast Conference (formerly the NYCAC) titles, prior to its entrance into the Northeast-10 Conference nine years ago, and has been awarded 11 NCAA Tournament bids in its 18 years competing exclusively at the NCAA Division II level. Saint Rose has compiled a 393-159 (.712) record during that time and has captured three NCAA Tournament Northeast Regional Championships on the way to three “Elite Eight” appearances and a trip to the “Final Four” in 1998. Furthermore, the Golden Knights advanced to the ECAC Championship Tournament in four of their non-NCAA Tournament years and came away with titles in both 1993 and 2001.

Beaury has furthermore established the Golden Knights as a traditional power within the NE-10, which has sent five teams to the NCAA Tournament in four of the past five seasons. Saint Rose owns both the third best overall and conference winning percentages during its tenure, having won 63.2 percent of its games, including 62.6 of its league contests.

The 47-year-old mentor has compiled a 501-206 (.709) career record, has earned Coach of the Year plaudits on five separate occasions and was nominated for National Coach of the Year in 1989 when the program was still part of the NAIA. He stands *ninth* among the nation’s most successful NCAA Division II coaches in terms of winning percentage. Additionally, his teams have qualified for postseason play in each of his 23 seasons and have won eight conference titles. Saint Rose has also played on national television, has had just one losing season under his tutelage and has won at least 19 games throughout 20 of his 23 years on the bench.

Impressive stuff indeed; but when you’re intelligent, committed, and an outstanding recruiter in addition to being a student of the game; good things are bound to come your way.

Beaury, who was *Eastern Basketball’s* 1998 small college Coach of the Year, is in high demand on the lecture circuit. He has spoken at clinics throughout the world including the renowned Eastern Invitational and Five Star Basketball Camps.

Beaury has also guided several college All-Star teams on summer tours throughout the world in recent years. He has coached college players on visits to Greece, Turkey, Spain, Cuba, Germany, Dominica, Montserrat, and Antigua to mention a few. He has also guided the Golden Knights on team trips to Spain, Italy, Cuba, Australia and Fiji.

A native of Queens and one of six children, Beaury played high school basketball at St. Agnes before heading to Saint Rose where he was a four-year letterwinner. He was also the recipient of the College’s 1996 Distinguished Alumni Award.

The three-time captain still ranks among the school’s top-10 career leaders in both assists and steals. A two-time All-Conference selection who was the team’s Most Valuable Player as a senior, Beaury entered the collegiate coaching ranks at the tender age of 21 when he landed the assistant’s position at the Junior College of Albany in 1982. Beaury then returned to his alma mater in 1984 and two years later was named the College’s second head coach. The rest you now know about.

Beaury also directs his own successful youth basketball camp every summer at the College. He was the founder of the Saint Rose Summer Sports Academy and is also the founder of the New York State Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Furthermore, Beaury was actively involved with the development office as co-chair of the College’s most recent capital campaign, *Advancing The Saint Rose Difference*. It marked the second time that Beaury co-chaired a capital campaign at Saint Rose during his tenure.

Beaury earned both his bachelor’s degree in business administration and his master’s in education from Saint Rose. He is taking a break from his M.B.A. studies at the College so he may spend more time with his family. He resides in Cohoes, NY with his wife, the former Mary Ann Grennon (Saint Rose ‘82), a member of the Saint Rose Athletics Hall of Fame, and their three children; Alexandra, Brian and Benjamin.

## Changes in the Northeast-10 Conference

Adelphi University formally became a member of the Northeast-10 Conference on July 1, 2009. Adelphi was offered and accepted membership in December, 2007.

Adelphi finished the 2008-09 academic year as a member of the East Coast Conference. The Panthers will enter the NE-10 as the defending NCAA Division II Women's Lacrosse National Champions.



With the addition of Adelphi the NE-10 now has 16 member institutions, which is the most among Division II along with the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) and the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC). The NE-10's 23 championship sports provide athletic opportunities for more than 5,500 student-athletes, the largest such program of any Division II conference.

# 2009-10 Saint Rose Men's Basketball Preview

## Introduction:

The College of Saint Rose arrives at this point aiming to prove that the first sub .500 season in head coach Brian Beaury's 23-year tenure was an anomaly. The Golden Knights went 11-17 overall and wound up 10<sup>th</sup> among 15 teams in the Northeast-10 Conference with a 9-13 slate last season. Three starters are among seven returning letterwinners to a very young squad that lists six newcomers on its roster. There are only four upperclassmen in addition to five freshmen and a like number of sophomores.

What does it all mean? We'll have a clearer picture come March although this is a team that has the potential to turn some heads despite being picked 10<sup>th</sup> among 16 squads in the ultra-competitive NE-10. The Golden Knights are after all the 11<sup>th</sup> all-time winningest program in NCAA Division II annals on the strength of 20, 19-victory campaigns throughout Beaury's tenure. Saint Rose has also earned 11 NCAA Tournament trips throughout the past 18 seasons and has gone 57-15 at home since the Events and Athletics Center was renovated prior to the start of the 2004-05 campaign.

From a more focused perspective, there is some experience despite the team's overall youth. Three of last year's top four scorers are back. There is also a true point guard in the mix for the first time in two years, which should help the club's offensive flow although rebounding and defense will be key features as usual.

## Letterwinners Lost (6):

There are several pieces missing from last year's squad including guard/forward Josh Pelletier who averaged 7.3 points and made 23 starts in 2008-09. Meanwhile, guard J.G. Braga made eight starts as a senior, while center Evan Lane delivered 9.9 points and 8.0 rebounds before being dismissed from the team late in the season. Also absent from last year's roster are guards Ben Johnson and Brian Ledbetter who averaged double-figures in minutes off the bench, along with backcourt partner Daniel Smalls who got in for eight games as a walk-on.

## Letterwinners Returning (7+1 Red Shirt Sophomore):

Two seniors, who will be counted upon to provide leadership, and a sophomore make up the trio of returning starters. Senior guard **Jermaine Clark** (Perth Amboy, NJ/Perth Amboy) garnered third-team All-Conference accolades after finishing eighth in the league with a team-leading 16.3 points per-game as a junior. The lone player to start all 28 contests in 2008-09, Clark drained a team-high 61 3-pointers and handed out 2.8 assists on a regular basis. Meanwhile, senior forward **Malcolm Williams** (Schenectady, NY/Schenectady) tossed in 9.0 ppg on 52.0 percent (91-for-175) shooting from the field, the league's sixth best mark. He also pulled down 5.8 rebounds and recorded 0.8 blocks per-outing.

Sophomore guard **Shea Bromirski** (Cambridge, NY/Cambridge Central) will most likely play off the ball a bit more this season. Bromirski finished second on the team in scoring with 11.4 ppg as a freshman. He drained 37.8 percent (54-for-143) of his attempts from beyond the arc, and led the NE-10 in free throw shooting at 91.8 percent (56-for-61).

Also back in the mix are sophomore center **Brian Hanuschak** (Cumberland, RI/St. Andrews), senior forward **Zach Bye** (Scotia, NY/Scotia-Glenville), and sophomore forward **Sheldon Griffin** (Lititz, PA/Warwick) along with sophomore swing **James Wilson** (Massapequa, NY/Massapequa).

The latter is not expected to dress following preseason surgery. Wilson averaged 16.8 minutes off the bench throughout 24 games last season. Hanuschak has earned the starting center role. He averaged 3.9 points and 2.9 rebounds in 27 games last season, but showed his potential by finishing in double-figures scoring during the final two games of his freshman campaign. Griffin is also expected to have an expanded role after appearing in 16 games a year ago, while Bye should once again provide help in the frontcourt.

The final returnee is sophomore guard **Rob Gutierrez** (Brooklyn, NY/John Adams) who sat out last season. An outstanding defender and "energy" player, Gutierrez averaged 2.5 ppg throughout 10.5 minutes of playing time as a freshman in 2007-08.

## Newcomers (6):

A quintet of freshmen and a junior transfer comprise this year's incoming class. **Andre Pope** (White Plains, NY/Iona Prep) is expected to step in immediately as the starting point guard. Pope led Iona Prep to the city and state championship last season and was a CHSAA All-League pick for the Gaels.

Pope is joined by rookie forwards **Jin Hong** (Hicksville, NY/Archbishop Molloy) and **Devin Grimes** (Albany, NY/Catholic Central), junior swing **Andy Pelletier** (Troy, NY/Troy), freshman guard **Kyle Bender** (Wappingers Falls, NY/Roy C. Ketcham) and freshman center **Zach McNall** (Buskirk, NY/Hoosic Valley).

Hong is a raw talent with great upside while Grimes was a first-team Big 10 All-Star as both a junior and senior for the Crusaders. Pelletier is the younger brother of Josh and arrives via NE-10 rival Franklin Pierce where he appeared in 19 games last season. Bender and McNall are both walk-ons who will provide depth in the frontcourt and backcourt respectively.

## Schedule:

Saint Rose will encounter 22 NE-10 games with home and home series versus Assumption, American International, first-year member Adelphi, Pace, New Haven, Southern Connecticut State and Le Moyne. The Golden Knights will also host Saint Michael's, Southern New Hampshire, UMass Lowell and Stonehill; and will travel to Franklin Pierce, Saint Anselm, Merrimack and Bentley.

The non-league schedule is comprised of three home dates and a pair of road contests. The Golden Knights will host Bloomfield, Concordia and Mercy; and will head to Philadelphia University and C.W. Post. Seven squads on the docket, including five who represent the NE-10, garnered NCAA Tournament invitations, while the five non-conference opponents recorded an 85-64 record in 2008-09.

One noticeable difference is the presence of Adelphi as a conference opponent. The Panthers, a formal rival of the Golden Knights in the East Coast Conference, officially became the NE-10's 16<sup>th</sup> member beginning with the 2009-10 academic year.

## Summation:

As usual, there is plenty to like about the Golden Knights although there are several unanswered questions, mostly due to the team's youth, at this juncture. There is depth, an exciting group of newcomers that are out to prove themselves, and a nucleus of veterans who are determined to put the Golden Knights back into the upper echelon of the NE-10.

Clark is the consummate scorer, while Williams and Bye are athletic frontcourt players. Bromirski poses a legitimate outside threat and Gutierrez is a stellar perimeter defender. Furthermore, Pope is a true point guard, and Hanuschak and Griffin appear to be on the cusp of coming into their own.

Thus, look for the Golden Knights to surprise a few people along the way. They may be a bit removed from making a legitimate run at a league championship with the likes of Merrimack and Bentley appearing in every preseason national poll. Regardless, Saint Rose will undoubtedly not be taken lightly by anyone throughout the year.

## 2008-09 IN REVIEW

### SAINT ROSE ONCE AGAIN MAKES A POSTSEASON APPEARANCE

Saint Rose has qualified for postseason play in each of Brian Beaury's 23 previous years at the helm following last year's run to the NE-10 Tournament. There were also several other noteworthy accomplishments last season.

- Brian Beaury became just the ninth active head coach, and 34<sup>th</sup> overall, at the NCAA Division II level to ascend the 500-win plateau by virtue of a 70-52 victory at Saint Michael's on February 4, 2009.
- Jermaine Clark became only the 23<sup>rd</sup> player in school annals to score 1,000 points with a 14 point effort at Stonehill (2/21/09).
- Clark was furthermore named a third-team NE-10 All-Conference pick.
- Shea Bromirski led the NE-10 in FT% (.918)
