# Karen Haag ..... Head Coach



Karen Haag is in her ninth year as head coach of The College of Saint Rose women's basketball team where she has remodeled the Golden Knights into a team that is once again poised to stake its claim as an elite NCAA program. Haag has accomplished that by establishing herself as an astute leader and by providing the College's highly visible women's basketball program with a sense of consistency and a progressive mindset.

"Maintaining the tradition of excellence in the basketball program would be impossible without the support of the

College, the athletics department and the tremendous efforts of the student-athletes, support staff and the coaches here at Saint Rose. One of our goals is to instill a pattern of success in our players and constantly challenge them to reach their potential as a student and an athlete. We have lofty goals for the program and truly believe that basketball is an important factor in preparing our student-athletes for life," says Haag.

Haag's impact is quite apparent. Saint Rose has garnered three bids to the NCAA Tournament within the past four years and has made seven straight appearances in the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament throughout her tenure.

The 2008-09 season served only to bolster the program's credibility as a contender in the East Region. Saint Rose was awarded a spot in the 2009 NCAA Tournament on the strength of a 20-11 overall record and advanced to the semifinals of the NE-10 Tournament for the third time in four years. Haag, who has registered at least 19 wins in three of the past four seasons, recorded her 100<sup>th</sup> win as the Golden Knights' mentor midway through the year. Haag was named the WBCA Most Inspirational Division II Coach in January and by season's end had produced the fifth Saint Rose player to garner All-America honors throughout the College's 18-year NCAA II era in Lauren Revesz ('09).

Following the 2006-07 campaign, Haag was awarded the 2007 Russell Athletic/WBCA Region 1 Coach of the Year after Saint Rose won its first eight regular-season contests, was ranked as high as 20<sup>th</sup> in the USA Today/ESPN Division II poll and finished with a 21-9 overall record en route to a second place finish in the NE-10 standings (16-6). It marked the first time the Golden Knights were ranked nationally since the 2000-01 campaign.

The 2005-06 season was a major stepping stone for Haag as she guided the Golden Knights to a 19-13 overall mark and an appearance in the NE-10 Tournament championship game. After winning its last six games to close out the season, Saint Rose was rewarded with its first NCAA Tournament bid in five years. Furthermore, it marked the first winning season for the women's basketball program in Haag's tenure.

Haag has certainly brought the program a long way in her relatively short tenure. She was dealt a difficult hand during her first year on Western Avenue as Saint Rose finished 8-18 in 2001-02. Haag had to make do without the presence of a National Player of the Year candidate, while injuries left her with only six healthy bodies by the time February rolled around. Regardless, the Golden Knights proved that they had absorbed their mentor's teaching, sense of accountability and commitment by winning two of their final four games at a time when nobody would have batted an eye had they simply closed shop and called it a year.

The Golden Knights were well underway to building upon that momentum the following year when they won three of their first five games. Unfortunately, the injury bug struck again and Saint

Rose had to make a go of it without two of its more prominent players the rest of the way. The end result was an 8-19 mark and a plethora of questions of what may have been.

Haag arrived at this junction of her career via Wilkes University, a NCAA III institution in Northeastern Pennsylvania, where she spent 10 years at the helm of the Lady Colonels after spending two years at SUNY-Delhi. With Haag's guidance, Wilkes made four postseason appearances throughout her final eight years and won the 1993 ECAC South Region title, the program's first championship of any kind. She also guided Wilkes to the Middle Atlantic Conference playoffs from 1995 through 1997, the first time in school history that the program made three consecutive conference playoff appearances.

Haag spent three summers coaching various college All-Star teams overseas including trips to Italy in 1997, Spain in 1996 and Australia in 1995. At SUNY-Delhi, Haag led the Broncos to a 34-13 record and into the quarterfinals of the NJCAA Region III Tournament during each of her two seasons. Prior to her tenure at Delhi, Haag was an assistant for former head coach Mari Warner at the University at Albany. Haag also held an assistant coach position at Ithaca College and spent three years as a head coach at Oneonta High School.

In addition to her coaching responsibilities, Haag is in charge of scheduling and also serves as the advisor to the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in her role as the department's Senior Woman Administrator.

A strong advocate of community service, Haag is a co-founder of Camp BraveHearts which is a series of retreats designed for women who have been diagnosed with cancer. The camp affords participants an opportunity to learn new skills, increase self-esteem and confidence, and help address the risks and fears that many women face during and after treatment. Haag, who is a cancer survivor herself, has also been involved with "Coaches vs Cancer" for the American Cancer Society. In September, Haag received the Make a Difference Award from the Susan G. Komen Foundation, an honor that is given once per-year to an outstanding individual who has made a difference in the lives of individuals facing breast cancer. Furthermore, she has served on the Wilkes-Barre YMCA Board of Directors in addition to participating in numerous other community service ventures.

Haag graduated from Oneonta State in 1984 with a degree in English and secondary education. She also holds a master's degree in curriculum planning and development from the University at Albany.

A star player in her own right, Haag is among Oneonta State's all-time leaders in scoring, assists and steals. The team's Most Valuable Player following both her junior and senior seasons, Haag garnered All-Conference accolades from the SUNYAC as a senior. She recently became the first female basketball player inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame.

**Series History:** Despite winning two in a row, Saint Rose trails the all-time series against American International 12-9. The Golden Knights halted a four-game skid against the Yellow Jackets with a 60-44 victory in Albany on January 3, 2009. Saint Rose also took a 57-49 triumph on its home floor back on November 21 and thus will look to sweep the regular-season series for the first time since the 2005-06 campaign.

**Last Meeting:** Saint Rose outscored visiting American International 12-3 during the final three minutes en route to a 57-49 Northeast-10 Conference victory on November 21 at the Daniel P. Nolan Gymnasium.

Sophomore guard Ashley Rath led the Golden Knights by scoring 14 of her team-high 17 points after halftime. Senior guard Elizabeth Buckley finished with 14 points and sophomore guard Ola Shajuyigbe added 12 points in 19 minutes off the bench. Furthermore, junior guard Lynsey Timbrouck wound up with seven points, eight rebounds, six assists and five steals.

The Yellow Jackets led throughout the first 36 minutes until Rath drained a 3-pointer from the right wing that made it 45-44 Saint Rose with 3:50 remaining. Less than a minute later, Shajuyigbe finished a conventional three-point play to put the Golden Knights ahead to stay at 48-46.

Buckley then nailed a jumper, Timbrouck went 1-for-2 from the foul line and Rath canned a trey from the right corner that afforded Saint Rose a 54-46 advantage with less than a minute to play.

Junior guard Adriana Johnson tossed in 17 points and sophomore forward Rhea Pascal added 10 points and six rebounds for the Yellow Jackets.

**Last Time Out:** Saint Rose rallied from a 10 point, first half deficit and held Assumption without a field goal throughout all but 19 seconds of the game's final 10 minutes en route to a 60-47 Northeast-10 Conference victory at the Daniel P. Nolan Gymnasium Wednesday night.

Sophomore guard Ashley Rath led the Golden Knights in scoring for the third straight time with 15 points. Sophomore center Ali Johnson finished with 13 points and seven rebounds, while senior guard Elizabeth Buckley scored 10 of her 13 points after halftime. Junior forward Amy Voelkel wound up with eight points and 12 boards, while junior guard Lynsey Timbrouck dished out six assists and committed only one turnover. It marked her third

straight game with at least half a dozen helpers.

The Golden Knights found themselves down 22-12 with 9:16 left until intermission when they scored seven unanswered points to cut their deficit to three, 22-19, with 5:18 to go. Rath finished off a Timbrouck steal and Buckley canned a trey to cap the spurt. Assumption sophomore forward Kelly Meredith scored a layup to halt the run and Saint Rose eventually went into the locker room down a bucket, 28-26, at the break.

Johnson opened the second period with a layup that tied the game, 28-28, for the first time since a 2-2 deadlock in the very early going. There were three additional ties throughout the ensuing nine minutes, before Buckley ignited an 18-5 final push by knocking down back-to-back 3-pointers. After Assumption junior guard Molly Griffiths canned a 3-pointer that made it 42-42 at the 10:08 mark, the Greyhounds did not score from the field until they converted a moot bucket in the game's waning moments.

Meredith finished with 12 points and seven rebounds to lead Assumption, while senior forward Kayla Parker and freshman guard Gabrielle Gibson tossed in 11 and nine points respectively.

**Scouting the Golden Knights (11-10/10-6 NE-10):** Saint Rose won for the sixth time in its last seven outings and improved its record to 8-3 at home behind Wednesday's 60-47 win over Assumption...The Golden Knights have now won five straight at home where they own a +7.0 scoring margin and a +4.3 rebounding edge...Five players (Rath, Buckley, Johnson, Timbrouck, Voelkel) have started at least 19 of the squad's 21 games this season...They average between 25.1 and 39.3 minutes per-game and account for 79.5 percent (1039-of-1307) of the team's scoring production...Rath (14.7 ppg) and Buckley (11.6 ppg) are the lone double-figure scorers...Rath has been in twin-figures in 12 of the last 14 games...Buckley is just 45 points shy of becoming the 22nd player in school history to score 1,000 career points (955)...Timbrouck (39.33 mpg) and Rath (36.81 mpg) are first and third in the league in minutes per-game...Timbrouck is in sole possession of fifth place (357) on the College's all-time leader chart in assists...The Golden Knights are currently alone in fifth place in the NE-10 standings with six league games remaining...Beginning today, their next two opponents (American Int'l & Adelphi) own a collective 10-32 (.238) record...Saint Rose has already defeated both opponents back in November.

**Scouting the Yellow Jackets (7-14/5-11 NE-10):** American International dropped a heartbreaker 46-45 at New Haven on Wednesday night after the Chargers buried a 3-pointer with 0.6 seconds remaining...It marked the sixth loss in the last seven games for the Yellow Jackets...Junior guard Adriana Johnson is the only player averaging double-figures in scoring (10.7 ppg)...Johnson also paces the squad in assists (3.24 apg) and steals (2.38 spg)...The latter is tied for the league's third-highest mark.

**Floor General:** Junior guard Lynsey Timbrouck ranks among the league's top-three in four statistical categories...Timbrouck leads the NE-10 in assists (5.52 apg), is tied for third in steals (2.38 spg) and is third in A:TO ratio (1.55)...She is also logging more minutes (39.33) than any other player in the league...She played a career-high 55 minutes at Bentley on January 26...Timbrouck is currently fifth all-time in school annals with 357 career assists.

**Rath Among NE-10 Best:** Sophomore guard Ashley Rath has led Saint Rose in scoring 11 times this season...She has tossed in no less than 14 points on all 11 occasions, including a career-best 26 point performance in a 64-42 win versus Bloomfield to begin the 2009-10 slate...Rath is among the league's top-seven in 3-point field goals made (1.95 p/g), 3-point field goal percentage (.373) and minutes (36.81)...She is furthermore sixth in scoring (14.7 ppg).

**Home Sweet Home:** The Golden Knights have found great success at the Daniel P. Nolan Gymnasium since its renovation prior to the 2004-05 season...Saint Rose has posted a 55-21 home slate for a .724 winning percentage...Furthermore, the Golden Knights have defeated three ranked opponents on their home floor.

**Dialing Long Distance:** Senior guard Elizabeth Buckley entered the 2009-10 campaign ranked fifth on the College's all-time list in 3-point field goals made (166)...She buried 60 treys last season, which was the eighth-highest total in school history...She also knocked down 35.5 percent (60-for-169) of her attempts from the arc.

**Another Milestone:** The Saint Rose women's basketball program recorded its 600th win via a 57-41 triumph versus Saint Michael's on January 6...Since commencing their inaugural season in 1973-74, the Golden Knights have put together a 606-353 slate (.632) and have registered 15, 20-win seasons...Saint Rose has additionally won 30+ games on two occasions, including the 1999-00 season when the Golden Knights finished with a school record 34 victories...Saint Rose and North Dakota (2005-06), which now plays at the Division I level, are the lone DII institutions to reel off 34 consecutive victories in a single-season.

**NE-10 Preseason Coaches' Poll:** Stonehill was selected first in the preseason coaches poll on the strength of 11 first place votes. The Skyhawks return two All-Conference performers from last year's 22-9 squad. Bentley was chosen second, while national runner-up Franklin Pierce earned three first place votes and the third spot in the poll. Saint Rose had 100 points to finish 13 points behind Le Moyne and 12 points behind New Haven in 10th.
