Karen Haag Head Coach



Karen Haag is in her ninth year as head coach of The College of Saint Rose women's basketball team where she has remodeled the Golden Knights into a team that is once again poised to stake its claim as an elite NCAA program. Haag has accomplished that by establishing herself as an astute leader and by providing the College's highly visible women's basketball program with a sense of consistency and a progressive mindset.

"Maintaining the tradition of excellence in the basketball program would be impossible without the support of the

College, the athletics department and the tremendous efforts of the student-athletes, support staff and the coaches here at Saint Rose. One of our goals is to instill a pattern of success in our players and constantly challenge them to reach their potential as a student and an athlete. We have lofty goals for the program and truly believe that basketball is an important factor in preparing our student-athletes for life," says Haag.

Haag's impact is quite apparent. Saint Rose has garnered three bids to the NCAA Tournament within the past four years and has made seven straight appearances in the Northeast-10 Conference Tournament throughout her tenure.

The 2008-09 season served only to bolster the program's credibility as a contender in the East Region. Saint Rose was awarded a spot in the 2009 NCAA Tournament on the strength of a 20-11 overall record and advanced to the semifinals of the NE-10 Tournament for the third time in four years. Haag, who has registered at least 19 wins in three of the past four seasons, recorded her 100th win as the Golden Knights' mentor midway through the year. Haag was named the WBCA Most Inspirational Division II Coach in January and by season's end had produced the fifth Saint Rose player to garner All-America honors throughout the College's 18-year NCAA II era in Lauren Revesz ('09).

Following the 2006-07 campaign, Haag was awarded the 2007 Russell Athletic/WBCA Region 1 Coach of the Year after Saint Rose won its first eight regular-season contests, was ranked as high as 20th in the USA Today/ESPN Division II poll and finished with a 21-9 overall record en route to a second place finish in the NE-10 standings (16-6). It marked the first time the Golden Knights were ranked nationally since the 2000-01 campaign.

The 2005-06 season was a major stepping stone for Haag as she guided the Golden Knights to a 19-13 overall mark and an appearance in the NE-10 Tournament championship game. After winning its last six games to close out the season, Saint Rose was rewarded with its first NCAA Tournament bid in five years. Furthermore, it marked the first winning season for the women's basketball program in Haag's tenure.

Haag has certainly brought the program a long way in her relatively short tenure. She was dealt a difficult hand during her first year on Western Avenue as Saint Rose finished 8-18 in 2001-02. Haag had to make do without the presence of a National Player of the Year candidate, while injuries left her with only six healthy bodies by the time February rolled around. Regardless, the Golden Knights proved that they had absorbed their mentor's teaching, sense of accountability and commitment by winning two of their final four games at a time when nobody would have batted an eye had they simply closed shop and called it a year.

The Golden Knights were well underway to building upon that momentum the following year when they won three of their first five games. Unfortunately, the injury bug struck again and Saint

Rose had to make a go of it without two of its more prominent players the rest of the way. The end result was an 8-19 mark and a plethora of questions of what may have been.

Haag arrived at this junction of her career via Wilkes University, a NCAA III institution in Northeastern Pennsylvania, where she spent 10 years at the helm of the Lady Colonels after spending two years at SUNY-Delhi. With Haag's guidance, Wilkes made four postseason appearances throughout her final eight years and won the 1993 ECAC South Region title, the program's first championship of any kind. She also guided Wilkes to the Middle Atlantic Conference playoffs from 1995 through 1997, the first time in school history that the program made three consecutive conference playoff appearances.

Haag spent three summers coaching various college All-Star teams overseas including trips to Italy in 1997, Spain in 1996 and Australia in 1995. At SUNY-Delhi, Haag led the Broncos to a 34-13 record and into the quarterfinals of the NJCAA Region III Tournament during each of her two seasons. Prior to her tenure at Delhi, Haag was an assistant for former head coach Mari Warner at the University at Albany. Haag also held an assistant coach position at Ithaca College and spent three years as a head coach at Oneonta High School.

In addition to her coaching responsibilities, Haag is in charge of scheduling and also serves as the advisor to the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee in her role as the department's Senior Woman Administrator.

A strong advocate of community service, Haag is a co-founder of Camp BraveHearts which is a series of retreats designed for women who have been diagnosed with cancer. The camp affords participants an opportunity to learn new skills, increase self-esteem and confidence, and help address the risks and fears that many women face during and after treatment. Haag, who is a cancer survivor herself, has also been involved with "Coaches vs Cancer" for the American Cancer Society. In September, Haag received the Make a Difference Award from the Susan G. Komen Foundation, an honor that is given once per-year to an outstanding individual who has made a difference in the lives of individuals facing breast cancer. Furthermore, she has served on the Wilkes-Barre YMCA Board of Directors in addition to participating in numerous other community service ventures.

Haag graduated from Oneonta State in 1984 with a degree in English and secondary education. She also holds a master's degree in curriculum planning and development from the University at Albany.

A star player in her own right, Haag is among Oneonta State's all-time leaders in scoring, assists and steals. The team's Most Valuable Player following both her junior and senior seasons, Haag garnered All-Conference accolades from the SUNYAC as a senior. She recently became the first female basketball player inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame.

Series History: Saint Rose owns a slim 10-8 lead in the all-time series that dates back to 1991. The Golden Knights took the lone meeting between the two clubs this year behind a 67-60 triumph in North Andover, MA back on January 20. Today marks only the second time these two teams will square off in a Northeast-10 Conference Tournament game. The Warriors captured a 69-56 quarterfinal victory in 2005 on the way to a Final Four appearance.

Last Meeting: Saint Rose outscored Merrimack 14-7 throughout the final 4:41 to take a 67-60 conference victory over the Warriors at the Volpe Center on January 20. The Golden Knights.

Neither side led by more than four points during the first 35 minutes until Saint Rose embarked on its decisive run down the stretch. With the score tied for the ninth time at 53-53, sophomore forward Ali Johnson scored in the paint to spark a quick 6-0 burst for the Golden Knights. Senior guard Elizabeth Buckley added a layup and sophomore guard Ashley Rath buried a pair of free throws that put Saint Rose on top 59-53 with 2:10 to go.

Merrimack cut its deficit in half when senior guard Casey Miller knocked down a 3-pointer at the other end. However, junior forward Amy Voelkel answered with a "three" of her own and the Golden Knights went 5-for-6 from the stripe in the waning moments to seal things.

Saint Rose knocked down 10, 3-pointers in the contest (10-for-22) and picked up 17 assists on 24 field goals. Meanwhile, the Warriors coughed up the ball 20 times, but shot 47.2 percent (25-for-53) from the floor to keep themselves close throughout.

Voelkel recorded a "double-double" by tossing in a career-high 16 points and hauling in 10 rebounds to lead Saint Rose. Rath and Buckley also dropped in 16 points apiece while combining for six, 3-pointers.

Miller led all scorers with 18 points to pace Merrimack. Freshman forward Kelly Schatzlein filled up the box score with 15 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists, while sophomore guard Gennifer Roy added 15 points, all in the second half.

Last Time Out: Saint Rose used a pair of second half surges to eventually upend host Le Moyne College 61-55 Wednesday night in a league game at Ted Grant Court.

The Golden Knights generated some breathing room behind an 11-2 run to start the second period. Sophomore guard Ola

Shajuyigbe put up four straight points to get things going and classmate Ashley Rath drained a 3-pointer to put Saint Rose in front 41-30 with 14:38 to go.

The Dolphins showed their resolve when senior guard Muffy Sadler put the finishing touches on a 15-5 jaunt with a trey of her own to get Le Moyne back to within a point, 46-45, with 9:31 left. Sadler sparked the run with three consecutive free throws after being fouled behind the arc and then closed things out with five straight points to put the Dolphins in business.

The Golden Knights then embarked on a decisive 15-4 run that put the game out of reach, thus earning a sweep of the regular-season series against Le Moyne for the second year in a row. Five different players found the scoring column during the outburst as junior guard Lynsey Timbrouck went 1-for-2 from the line to give Saint Rose a comfortable 61-49 cushion with 54 seconds on the clock.

Rath led the Golden Knights in scoring with 17 points on the strength of five, 3-pointers. Timbrouck added 12 points and four assists, while Shajuyigbe contributed 10 points.

Scouting the Golden Knights (15-12): Saint Rose has won 10 of its last 13 outings and is making its seventh straight NE-10 Tournament appearance under ninth-year head coach Karen Haag...The Golden Knights are 10-7 all-time in conference tournament games, including a 4-1 mark in first round affairs...Five players (Rath, Buckley, Johnson, Timbrouck, Voelkel) have started at least 25 of the squad's 27 games this season...They average between 25.7 and 38.9 minutes per-game and account for 77.0 percent (1315-of-1707) of the team's scoring production...Rath (14.7 ppg), Buckley (10.7 ppg) and Johnson (10.1) are all tossing in double-figures...Rath has been in twin-figures in 18 of the last 20 games...Buckley is just 12 points shy of becoming the 22nd player in school history to score 1,000 career points (988)...Timbrouck (38.9 mpg) and Rath (36.1 mpg) are first and fifth in the league in minutes per-game...Timbrouck is also in sole possession of fifth place (385) on the College's all-time leader chart in assists and moved into 15th place on the all-time steals chart (181) with two thefts at Le Moyne...Saint Rose went just 1-4 during its non-conference schedule this year...Its five opponents own a collective 84-43 overall record (.661) and a 27-16 non-conference slate (.628)...Three of the five teams (Holy Family, Bridgeport, Florida Southern) are ranked in their respective NCAA Regional Polls.

Scouting the Warriors (11-16): Merrimack has won two of its last three games despite an 81-75 loss versus Southern New Hampshire on Wednesday...The Warriors were the only squad to upend regular-season champion Franklin Pierce (71-64), which they accomplished on the road just 11 days ago...Roy leads three players in double-figures with 14.6 points per-game...Miller adds 13.3 points a night and junior guard Sarah Benischek tosses in 10.9 points to go with 5.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists.

Floor General: Junior guard Lynsey Timbrouck ranks among the league's top-three in four statistical categories...Timbrouck ranks second in the NE-10 in assists (5.33 apg) and A:TO ratio (1.60); and is third in steals (2.33 spg)...She is also logging more minutes (38.93) than any other player in the league...She played a career-high 55 minutes in a triple-overtime loss at Bentley on January 26...Timbrouck is currently fifth all-time in school annals with 385 career assists and 15th in steals (181).

Home Sweet Home: The Golden Knights have found great success at the Daniel P. Nolan Gymnasium since its renovation prior to the 2004-05 season...Saint Rose has posted a 56-22 home slate for a .718 winning percentage...Furthermore, the Golden Knights have defeated three ranked opponents on their home floor.

Dialing Long Distance: Senior guard Elizabeth Buckley entered the 2009-10 campaign ranked fifth on the College's all-time list in 3-point field goals made (170)...She buried 60 treys last season, which was the eighth-highest total in school history...She also knocked down 35.5 percent (60-for-169) of her attempts from the arc.

Another Milestone: The Saint Rose women's basketball program recorded its 600th win via a 57-41 triumph versus Saint Michael's on January 6...Since commencing their inaugural season in 1973-74, the Golden Knights have put together a 610-355 slate (.632) and have registered 15, 20-win seasons...Saint Rose has additionally won 30+ games on two occasions, including the 1999-00 season when the Golden Knights finished with a school record 34 victories...Saint Rose and North Dakota (2005-06), which now plays at the Division I level, are the lone DII institutions to reel off 34 consecutive victories in a single-season.

NE-10 Tournament History: The Golden Knights appeared in their sixth straight Northeast-10 Conference tournament last season. Saint Rose earned the seventh seed and advanced all the way to the league semifinal contest before falling 65-63 at Bentley. It marked the third semifinal appearance for the Golden Knights in four years.

The 2007 tournament saw the Golden Knights upend Bryant on its home floor, 78-73, in a quarterfinal match-up before having its tournament run come to a halt in a 78-72 overtime setback versus Pace.

The 2006 postseason run was one of the most memorable conference tournaments in program history as the Golden Knights advanced to their first NE-10 Championship game under head coach Karen Haag's tutelage. Saint Rose took a 72-66 triumph over Stonehill in the semifinal, only to suffer a 60-51 defeat at the hands of Southern Connecticut State in the title game.

The Golden Knights' first round game against Le Moyne in 2006 marked the first time in Haag's tenure that Saint Rose was in a position to host an opening-round tournament game. With a slim 59-58 quarterfinal victory over American International, the Golden Knights advanced to the tournament semifinals, the second of four appearances in school history.

In 2005, the Golden Knights defeated Stonehill in the first round of the tournament and later fell to eventual Final Four participant Merrimack in the NE-10 Quarterfinals.

During its first year of membership in the NE-10 (2000-01), Saint Rose fell 60-58 to eventual National Champion Bentley in the league title game.

Prior to joining the NE-10, Saint Rose made seven straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament while winning six consecutive NYCAC Championships. In 1999-00, the Golden Knights were also the NCAA Northeast Regional Champions, eventually finishing their season at 34-1 with an Elite Eight loss to Northern Kentucky. Saint Rose is one of only two teams (North Dakota, 2005-06) to record 34 straight wins in a season.
